Dear Friends,
 Easter Sunday may have been two weeks ago, but Easter Time is still just beginning. Other than Ordinary Time, Easter Time is the longest season of the Church year. Unlike Advent and Lent, two seasons that look forward to the two major feast days of the year, Easter is a season that prolongs the feast that's already been celebrated. Because the resurrection of Christ is so important, the event calls for a celebration that continues for many weeks.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: During Easter Time, we don't hear any readings from the Old Testament. Instead, the first reading is taken from the Acts of the Apostles, which is like reading a diary of the early church. We hear how the disciples, especially Saints Peter and Paul, taught and preached and expanded Christianity in, around, and beyond Jerusalem. Today Peter explains to his Jewish audience that what had been told by the prophets throughout the centuries came to fulfillment in Jesus.

STEWARDSHIP: Through the Eucharist we enjoy a unique union with Christ and, in Him, with one another. We are called to be a living Eucharist to others as they recognize Christ through our actions, as His stewards.

A REMINDER: This weekend we celebrate First Holy Communion with 6 children on Saturday at the 5:30 pm Mass at St. Anthony and with 3 children on Sunday at the 10 am Mass at St. Augustine. Let us keep these children and their families in our prayers as they celebrate this wonderful milestone in their Faith Journey.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I be a witness? How do I explain what the presence of Jesus in my life means?

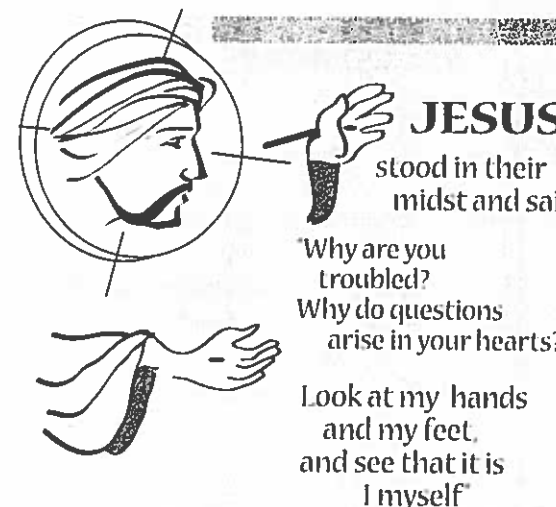

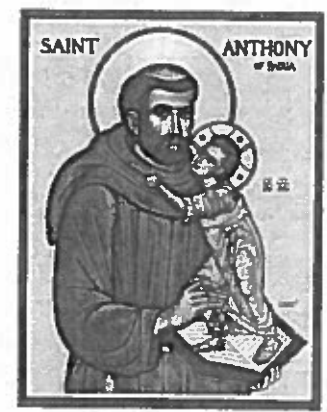
