Dear Friends,

Last week's Gospel told of Jesus' baptism, when the Father revealed to all those present that Jesus was the Son of God. To-day's Gospel tells of Jesus' first miracle, changing the water to wine at a wedding banquet. John calls his miracles *signs*, for they reveal Jesus' divinity to everyone who witnesses the event. Here, John immediately points out that his disciples respond with faith. As this was Jesus' first sign, this is when they begin to believe. All these centuries later, may listening to Jesus' wondrous deeds yet again strengthen our faith as well.

<u>THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON</u>: In today's first reading, Isaiah celebrates a transformed Jerusalem; what had been forsaken and desolate is now delightful and foreshadowing the Gospel espoused. Paul tells the Corinthians that the Holy Spirit transforms each and every one of them, though in different ways. Finally, in the Gospel, Jesus transforms water to wine, saving the newlyweds from terrible embarrassment. May we never overlook God's power to transform our lives.

STEWARDSHIP: St. Paul reminds us that Stewardship is a dynamic reality that changes according to giftedness and circumstances. To be good Stewards of the gifts God has given us, we must first examine the areas in which we spend our time, use our talents, and give of our treasure. It is interesting to see a pattern of our daily lives through our calendars and our checkbooks. Just as there are many different types of people in a parish, there are also many different types of service activities within the parish community. Pray together as a family and ask God to help you recognize the gifts He has bestowed on you. Then, in gratitude, ask how you can best share those gifts in His service and the service of your brothers and sisters in need.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Now that our Christmas Season is past and we have entered into "Ordinary" Time, let us still experience the "extraordinary" love of our God and praise him with our prayers. Also, may we spend time in prayerful reflection on the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children, January 22.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> Name one spiritual gift that I can identify in myself. How can I use that gift in service of the Lord? God bless,


Bunco Worker Schedules are available on the table at the back of Church.
