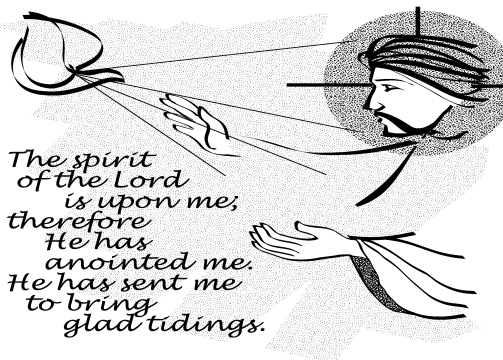

We encourage everyone 18 or older to register at the office as an adult parishioner.

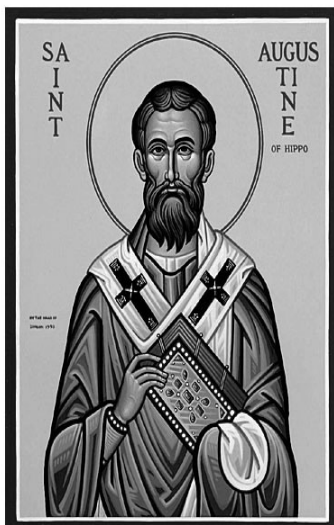

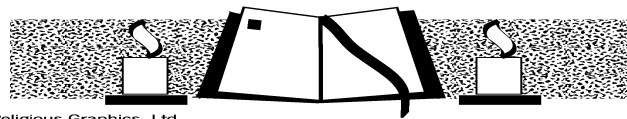

Dear Friends,

The concept of a jubilee year had its origin in the ancient Near East. According to Leviticus, every fifty years debts would be forgiven, servants would be released, property would be restored to its original owner, and fields would lie fallow. When Jesus is invited to read in his hometown's synagogue, he finds the passage in Isaiah that speaks of the jubilee year, then announces that this passage is fulfilled then and there in him. Since Jesus is with us when we gather in his name, it is fulfilled here and now as well. As we are now celebrating the Jubilee Year of Hope, may we find in Jesus the hope that this jubilee year may be fulfilled in our hearing.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: On this Sunday of the Word of God we hear scripture passages that affirm its paramount importance. In the first reading, Ezra reads from the Torah to the people of Jerusalem, gathered openly in public for one of the first times after their exile. In the Gospel, Jesus declares that the scripture passage from Isaiah is fulfilled in their presence. God's Word is celebrated and accomplished in these readings; may it be today as well.

STEWARDSHIP: Stewardship plays an important role in the lives of people who seek to follow Christ. We must be stewards of our personal vocations. In addition, we have a duty to be stewards of our Church: that community of disciples, that Body of Christ, of which we, individually and together, are the members, and in which "if one part suffers, all parts suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members share its joy."

A REMINDER: Be a Pilgrim of Hope in this Jubilee Year and allow the Lord to lead to you to new heights of holiness as you ground yourself in prayer and spiritual reading,

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How do I apply the word of God in my life? Can I commit to spending time each day this week reading from the Bible?
