Dear Friends,

The readings we will hear today remind us that we are fortunate to be alive for this blessed season of Lent. Why? Because it means we still have the opportunity to repent of our sins and to turn back to God with our whole hearts. We all sin; it is the human condition. But with hearts in the right place, we feel remorse for our sins and we promise God, others, and ourselves to do better. How lucky we are that we can! As we continue through this holy season, let us make the most of this opportunity.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: "I am who am," God proclaims to Moses from the burning bush. In saying this, God claims to be existence itself—as the one who simply is. Jesus further reveals his Father in the parable we hear in the Gospel: God is prepared to cut down the unfruitful fig tree but is also willing to give it another chance to bear fruit. We sing of this aspect of God in the responsorial psalm: "The Lord is kind and merciful." Let this refrain comfort us as we hear of those who were unexpectedly and tragically struck down.

STEWARDSHIP: In this season of Lent, the Church invites us to practice the traditional triad of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, while also encouraging us to adopt penitential practices of our own choice that suit our particular circumstances. St Paul reminds us of the generous gift of God in freeing us from sin and calling us to be His holy people. Let us practice our steward ship of time, which should include setting aside periods for family prayer, for the reading of Scripture, for visits to the Blessed Sacrament, and for attendance at Mass during the week whenever this is possible.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: As we continue through Lent, let us continue to renew ourselves even though the Ashes have faded and been washed away – we are still marked with the Cross of our repentance and redemption. Stations of the Cross this week at St. Augustine at followed by adult faith formation.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK</u>: Looking at this Jubilee Year of Hope from God's perspective, what can I do during the week ahead to justify God's hope in me?
