

Important Update: In a *Decree* approved by Pope Francis on Palm Sunday, April 13, 2025, the Dicastery for the Clergy has promulgated revised norms governing the discipline of Mass intentions. The updated legislation, which enters into effect on Easter Sunday, April 20, seeks to safeguard both the spiritual integrity of the Eucharistic sacrifice and the faithful's trust in the Church's handling of their offerings. The Decree will affect the scheduling of any future Mass Intention. Under the Decree, one intention will be allowed per Mass, with exception under strict conditions. As of now, any intention that has already been scheduled will not be affected.

Dear Friends,

Alleluia! He is risen! Jesus Christ, having made the ultimate sacrifice for the sake of our sins, has been raised from the dead. He has atoned for our sins and conquered death. Neither death nor sin have the final say any longer. We are a people redeemed, pilgrims of hope on a journey to new life. We gather today in joy in this holy place to hear the testimony of his earliest disciples, to renew our baptismal promises, and to partake in the Eucharistic feast and receive the risen Lord. Truly this is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad!

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: On Easter Sunday, we hear some of Jesus' earliest disciples testify to the unprecedented event they had witnessed. Saint Peter addresses an assembly of Gentiles, teaching them about Jesus and how God raised him from the dead. Saint Paul preaches about the effect Christ's resur-rection has had on his life. In the Gospel, Saint Mary Magdalene, the first to see the empty tomb, frantically announces the news to two of Jesus' closest disciples. None of his disciples yet understood that Jesus had to rise from the dead, but the disciple whom Jesus loved believed at once. Let us consider how we ourselves testify to the Resurrection.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: As Christians we celebrate God's gift of life for us. We are called to open our hearts, to take responsibility for our God-given gifts, and to share the joy of life with others. Then we will experience a new way of life ... Stewardship.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: At our Easter Vigil celebration we welcomed Gina Ratermann of St. Augustine Parish into full Communion in the Church. Please welcome her into our Faith Community.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How do I see my life and my world differently with eyes of faith?
