



Once I was dead, but now I am alive forever, therefore, john, write on the scroll what you see.

Dear Friends,

In 1931, a young Polish nun named Faustina Kowalska saw Jesus appear with rays of mercy emanating from his heart. He asked that an image of his divine mercy be venerated on the Sunday after Easter Sunday, which had long been associated with the final day of the Octave of Easter. On April 28, 1935—nearly exactly ninety years ago—Divine Mercy Sunday was celebrated for the first time with a completed painting of her vision of the merciful Lord. In 2000, Saint John Paul II decreed that this feast be made official worldwide.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Our readings challenge us to recognize the risen Lord's presence. In Acts, people from all around Jerusalem recognize the Lord's healing powers working through Peter, the disciple he left as head of the early church. John, the author of Revelation, recognizes the Lord in his visions. Thomas only recognizes the risen Lord when he sees him in the flesh, but then believes at once. Let us marvel at the strong faith of these early Christians.

<u>STEWARDSHIP</u>: Often, it is difficult to separate ourselves from the demands and possessions of the world, but there's a tremendous amount of peace that comes from every decision we make for Christ and his will for us. As our concept of stewardship continues to evolve, we are challenged to embrace fully Christ's teachings, no matter the cost. Stewardship requires constant conversion. But Jesus promises us that He will be with us and that He will give us His peace.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> We will be praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet before the Mass this weekend at St. Augustine. It is a beautiful prayerful recitation of the Mercy of Jesus on each of us and on the whole world. Next weekend at a 5:30pm Mass on Saturday, May 3, at St. Augustine we will be celebrating the Sacrament of First Holy Communion for 4 children from St. Augustine and 5 children from St. Anthony. Please keep them and their families in your prayers.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: Where and when do I recognize Christ's wounds in the body of Christ? What can I do to heal those wounds?

Vocations Spotlight:

Today's Gospel is the familiar story of Thomas' declaration of unbelief in the Resurrection until "I put my finger in the nail marks." These kinds of thoughts often attack the minds of those discerning a religious vocation. They are seeking that "definite" sign that the path they are pursuing is the right one. The Lord does not always afford that. Let us pray, often and loudly, for these discerners that they "hear the call" of the Lord and continue to respond to it.

Pro-Life Corner:

On the Second Sunday of Easter, the Church celebrates the Sunday of Divine Mercy. It provides an important opportunity to share Christ's message of mercy, especially with those who suffer because of their participation in one or more abortions. By the age of 45, as many as 1 in 3 women have had an abortion, and a similar number of men and family members have been involved. Many feel that abortion is "the unforgivable sin." They need to hear that, through the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives every sin of a repentant heart, even the sin of abortion. In fact, Jesus' message to St. Faustina is that the greater the sinner, the greater the right to His mercy.
