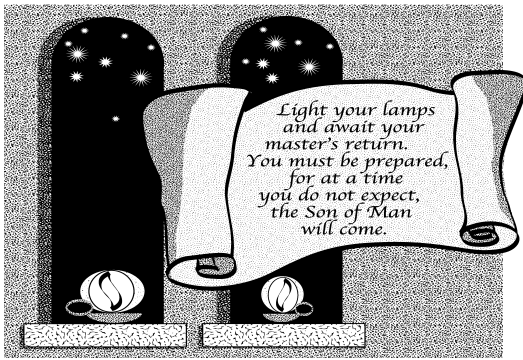

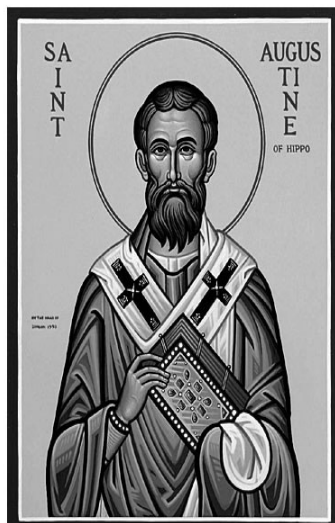

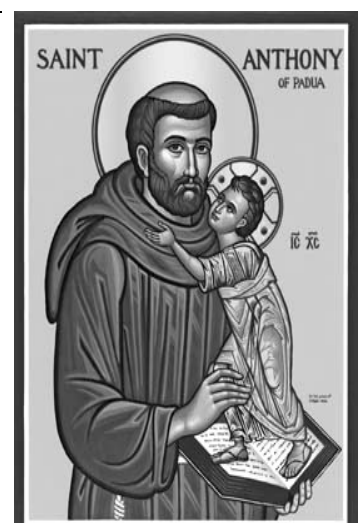

Dear Friends,

In this day and age when we can look up just about anything online and determine what is true and what is real, it's tough to have to rely on faith. But this is what God has asked us to do for thousands of years. One day our time on earth will come to an end—or the world itself will come to an end—and no internet source knows when that will be. We should be prepared at all times, just in case. Let us pray that when we gather together each week to worship God with our community of faith, our own faith is strengthened so that we can face our future with hope and resolve.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today's selections from scripture celebrate our forebears for their faith. Abraham's faith was so strong that he was willing to sacrifice his beloved son. Centuries later, the Chosen People have faith sufficient to courageously make their escape from bondage. Jesus asks his disciples to have faith in his return, for which they should always be prepared. May today's readings remind us to ask ourselves what we need to do to prepare ourselves for that day.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus sometimes describes a disciple's life in terms of stewardship, because this role sheds a certain light on discipleship. A steward is one to whom the owner of a household turns over responsibility for caring for the property, managing affairs, making resources yield as much as possible, and sharing the resources with others. The position involves trust and accountability. One day God will require an accounting of the use each person has made of the particular portion of what God has entrusted to him or her.

A REMINDER: This week school begins for our children. Let us keep them in mind as they enter another year of learning and growth. May God bless them and keep them safe. A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What can I do to build and deepen my faith? Whom can I wait on while I wait for the Lord's return?
