Dear Friends,

Today is the World Day of Migrants and Refugees, a day on which we recognize and honor those who accepted the challenge of leaving their homes and homelands to search for and work for a better life in a foreign land. Those who have never had to make such a radical decision find it difficult to imagine the incredible challenges refugees and migrants face on their journeys and in their new homes, much as the rich man in today's Gospel cannot imagine how the poor, sickly Lazarus ended up on his doorstep. May we never forget to see the face of Christ in the stranger and respond with heartfelt compassion.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: For the second Sunday in a row, we hear the prophet Amos deliver a harsh condemnation of the callous rich. Also once again, we hear Jesus tell a story to teach the proper attitude toward material wealth. Here, the rich man and Lazarus find their states completely reversed after they die. Let us heed the lessons Amos and Jesus teach us and pray that we never become blind and uncaring to those in desperate need.

STEWARDSHIP: All the rich materials and productions of this world, being God's property, are intended for God's service; and sin only, nothing but sin, turns them to a different purpose. The Christian steward has some natural responsibility for a portion of the world and an obligation in caring for it to acknowledge God's dominion.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> This week from Monday through Wednesday, the priests of the Belleville Diocese will be meeting in Convocation to discuss the future of our Diocese with the shortage of priests. We will be meeting this year in Mt. Vernon. Please keep the gathering of us in your prayers.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> Who do I choose to ignore who appears to be in need? To whom can I reach out with compassion and charity and without judgment or condescension?
