Over the last two thousand years Jesus has been given many titles, from Bread of Life to Our Savior. One of his first titles, going back to when he first stood and proclaimed God's word in the synagogue, is Rabbi, or Teacher. How appropriate to focus on that title on this first Sunday of September, a time of year when millions of young people are returning to school. Today we hear Jesus teach the crowds what it means to be a disciple. May he teach us as well as we gather together in his name.

**THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON:** Jesus, our teacher, offers lessons today on being a disciple. These lessons can be difficult—we must carry our own crosses, we must renounce all our possessions, we even must hate our own family, but, we gather as a family of faith in this place to hear them and reflect on them. The words of Wisdom may help, as they point out that as much as we try, we cannot possibly conceive the mind of God. Therefore, with faith and humility, let us listen to God's word.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Jesus' invitation to follow Him is addressed to us. We are Catholic citizens of a wealthy, powerful nation facing many questions about its identity and role in the 21st Century. We are members of a community of faith blessed with many human and material resources yet often uncertain about how to sustain and use them. Stewardship is a disciple's response.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Please welcome as Presider of the Masses at both Parishes this weekend, Fr. Nall, as I continue my Pilgrimage in Rome. I am keeping you all in my prayers as we visit the four Major Basilicas and other Churches and Shrines. Much to share when I return.
