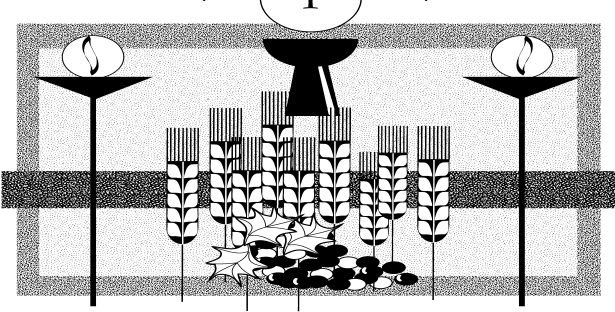

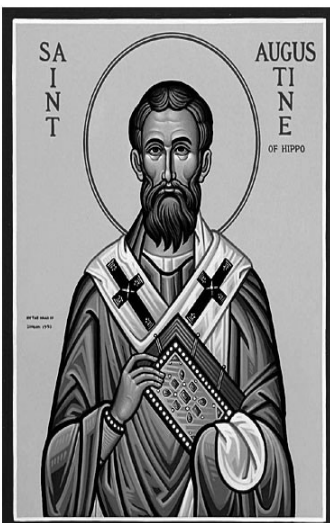

We encourage everyone 18 or older to register at the office as an adult parishioner.



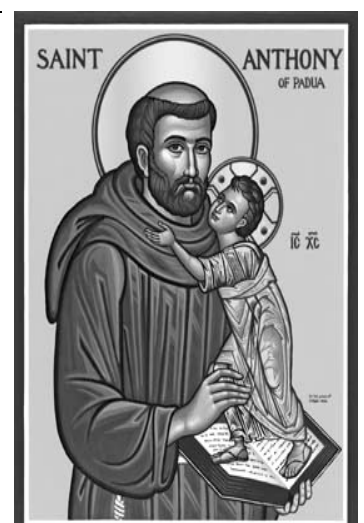

Dear Friends,

It's a scientific fact that the human body cannot last long without food or drink. We need to eat and drink to survive. But what Jesus offers is food and drink of another sort. It is the food and drink of eternal life. Today we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ, which he gave as a sacrifice for our sins and continues to give each time we celebrate the Eucharist. We consume his Body and Blood so that we can be nourished in carrying out his mission in the world and sustained on our journey to eternal life. Let us raise our voices in thanksgiving for our Lord's gift of his very Body and Blood.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: The food God provides is unique and special. Take the manna God provided in the desert. Twice Moses says in our first reading that this food was unknown to their ancestors. The food that Jesus provides was also unknown to anyone's ancestors and it is even more special, for it is Christ's own Body and Blood. Saint Paul reminds us that we participate in the Body and Blood of Christ when we share the Eucharist, and Jesus tells us that whoever does so remains in him and he in us. As we listen to the word of God, let us listen for the many ways God feeds us.

STEWARDSHIP: Through Eucharist, we enjoy a unique union with Christ and, in Him, with one another. His love indeed, His very Self - flows into His disciples and, through them and their practice of stewardship, to the entire human race. In the Eucharist, we reaffirm our participation in the New Covenant; we give thanks to God for blessings received; and we strengthen our bonds of commitment to one another as members of the covenant community Jesus forms.

A REMINDER: Do you remember your First Holy Communion? How excited you were to receive Jesus for the first time! Well nothing has changed – Jesus is as present in the Holy Eucharist today as he was back then. What is your current level of enthusiasm in receiving the Eucharist? It should be several times more than when you first received Him. Why? Because you have come to know and to believe in Him more deeply over the years and you are part of Him, the Body of Christ, the Church (as St. Paul reminds us).

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: When I receive the Eucharist, I receive Jesus within me. How does knowing that Jesus is in me affect the way I act in the world?

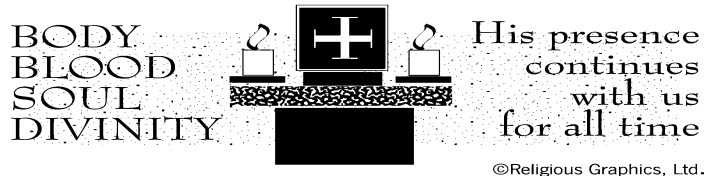

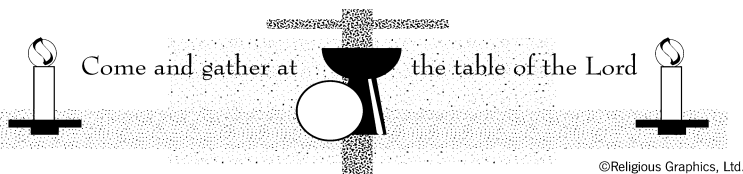
