



Dear Friends in Christ,

Many years ago, I made a retreat during Advent. The Jesuit priest leading the retreat offered a reflection on the Blessed Virgin Mary. The priest noted that the Blessed Mother has been given many titles by the Church: Gate of Heaven, Queen of Angels, Mother of the Church and many more.

Yet the priest felt another title should be given to the Virgin Mary: Perfect Welcome. The priest noted that throughout her life, Mary is Perfect Welcome: welcoming God, welcoming her Son Jesus, welcoming the shepherds and Magi, welcoming Jesus' disciples and welcoming us.

The priest then asked the people on retreat to reflect on our own lives: Did we experience Mary's welcome? Expanding the question, he asked if we had felt welcomed into our families, schools and teams.

Finally, he asked us to consider the welcome we offered other people in our lives. Did we feel that we offered other people a welcome similar to Mary's welcome?

At Christmas, I thank Mary for her Perfect Welcome and then ask that she help us as a Church and society to offer a more perfect welcome to the people in our world. Here I am thinking of children waiting to be born, the sick, the home bound, the poor and the vulnerable. Can we offer a better welcome to them in our lives?

When we reflect on the Lord's birth, we come to a renewed sense of wonder at the gift of human life. Moved by the love and humility of the Christ child, we realize that when we welcome the people around us, it is Christ we welcome.

Sadly in our culture there are movements in our state legislature to legalize so-called "physician assisted suicide." As a culture, are we sending a signal to people whose illness is believed terminal that they are not welcome in our society? Consider also the situation of migrants in our world; an incredible number of people across the globe are leaving their homes to have a chance for a better life in a different place. What can we do as Catholic people to respond to the plight of migrants?

This Christmas, please join me in reflecting on the Virgin Mary as Perfect Welcome. May she inspire us to welcome others with greater love in our hearts. May the Virgin Mary assist us by her prayers and place us close to Jesus her Son.

Dear Friends,

Christmas is so close now that we can nearly taste it! Children can hardly contain their excitement while adults panic about all they still need to do. But for now, let us consider Mary and Joseph, just days before she would give birth, struggling to make their way up an unfamiliar and dangerous road, hoping to make it to a warm, comfortable place to stay in the city of David. As we well know, nice warm places were no longer available, but it all worked out, even if not exactly as they had hoped. May we keep that in mind during these final days of preparing our hearts and our homes for Jesus' birth.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Drawing closer to Christmas, we sing, "Lord, make us turn to you; let us see your face and we shall be saved." Micah turned to Bethlehem and saw the face of the Messiah. Elizabeth saw and heard her pregnant cousin and recognized the face of the Lord. Even John the Baptist in his mother's womb turned to Mary's voice and leaped for joy. May we see the face of God in God's word, in the spirit of the season, and in the people we know and love.

STEWARDSHIP: Mary, by her example, most perfectly teaches the meaning of discipleship and stewardship in their fullest sense. All of their essential elements are found in her life: she was called and gifted by God; she responded generously, creatively and prudently; she understood her divinely assigned role as "handmaid" in terms of service and fidelity.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: What do I need to do in order to discern Jesus' presence in someone I've just met? in a friend? in someone I disagree with?




